



# Natural Horsemanship Day!

The Natural Horsemanship Day is where people compete in an individual natural horsemanship class with their horse. There class is judged and critiqued to help enhance performance.

**There is a series of 3 Natural Horsemanship Days.**

**The dates are: June 6, July 11, August 8, 2010.**

There will be an overall cumulative High Point award at the end of the series. In order to be eligible for this High Point Award **attendance at all three** Natural Horsemanship Days is required by the same person and horse team. At the end of each class participant will be given their test scores.

## Class details:

- You and your horse perform a series of natural horsemanship activities.
- Each activity within the class is timed so you will only have a set amount of time at each activity station.
- Depending on the class you sign up for activity stations may consist of transitions, walking over a tarp, moving sideways, figure 8 on line or off line etc.
- Pre-registration is required to obtain a specific class time.
- Cost per class: \$35.00 (non-refundable)
- Specific activity stations per class will be issued at time of pre-registration.
- If you miss your class time there are **NO Make-up times** and the class fee is non-refundable.
- **All participants are required to submit their horses shot records and a 2010 coggins test at time of pre-registration.**
- Fee for Auditors (people who come just to watch) is \$10.00 per person.

## Divisions Offered:

### Novice Division

This Division is for horseman who is just beginning with natural horsemanship training methods and is ready to test their skills. Participants will be judged in how well they demonstrate mutual respect, safety, and developing a relationship with the horse through positive communication, trust and confidence.

Class 1: Novice Ground Work is where the horse is on a 12 foot lead line

Class 2: Novice Mounted Work will include saddling and mounting

### Intermediate Division

This Division is for horseman's who have fine tuned the basic skills in gaining respect and responsiveness to achieve having the horse as an enthusiastic agreeable partner. Purpose is added to this level with the use of obstacles.

Class 3: Intermediate Work is where the horse is on a 22 foot line.

Class 4: Intermediate Mounted Work

### Advanced Division

This is where you have the fundamentals of natural horsemanship and apply them by reading the horse and being in unison with the horse.

Class 5: Advanced Work where the horse is on a 45 foot line.

Class 6: Advance Work where the horse is off line

Class 7: Advance Mounted Work
